During the bus city tour you will see Yusupov's Palace, the place of the killing of Romanov's favourite; Anichkov Palace where Nikolay II and his family lived before he became the emperor; the Winter Palace, the residence of the Russian emperors; Peter and Paul Fortress and many other famous places.





Hermitage

The Hermitage is the residence of the Russian emperors. The palace was constructed on a monumental scale that was intended to reflect the might and power of Imperial Russia. From the palace the Tsar ruled over 22,400,000 square kilometers (8,600,000 sq. mi) (almost 1/6 of the Earth's landmass) by the end of the 19th century. It was designed by many architects, mostly by Bartolomeo Rastrelli with his special unique style.

Peterhof

The Peterhof Museum Complex is one of the most popular museums not only in Russia, but in the whole world. Even a few hours here are enough to feel the spirit of history, which still lives here. As a former residence of the Russian monarchs, Peterhof brings together the finest achievements in national and international culture. This unique complex was created by outstanding architects, decorators and sculptors, whose spectacular works of art slot perfectly into the natural beauty of the coastal landscape.

Peter and Paul Fortress

The first structure to be built in St. Petersburg, and thus the birthplace of the city, it never served its intended defensive function. Instead it has had a rich, hugely varied, and sometimes sinister history as a military base, a home of government departments, the burial ground of the Russian Imperial family, the site of groundbreaking scientific experiments, and a forbidding jail that held some of Russia's most prominent political prisoners.

Catherine Palace in Tsarskoye Selo

The Catherine Palace is a Neoclassical residence of Catherine II of Russia on the bank of the Yauza River in Lefortovo, Moscow. It should not be confused with the much more famous Catherine Palace in Tsarskoye Selo. The residence is also known as the Golovin Palace, the first Chancellor of the Russian Empire. After his death Empress Anna commissioned Francesco Bartolomeo Rastrelli to replace the Golovin Palace with a Baroque residence known as Annenhof. This was Anna's preferred residence. It consisted of two wooden two-storey buildings, the Summer Palace and the Winter Palace.
